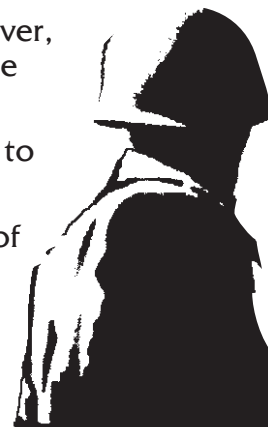


Sample Outreach/Educational Tools from Project YANO

Outreach/Educational Materials

A. ___-English ___-Spanish **Alternative Resources Directory.*** Created for San Diego area: brochure listing non-military job training and youth employment programs; some student aid information (for California). (5/99) 50¢.

B. ___-English ___-Spanish **The Military's Not Just a Job...It's Eight Years of Your Life.*** Brochure detailing problems with military careers and enlistment; questions to ask a recruiter; civilian job hunting tips. (Eng.-4/09, Span.-4/09) 70¢.

C. ___ **Careers in Peacemaking and Social Change.*** Brochure discussing how to make a career choice that is compatible with both income needs and ethical values (major revision 1/04). 70¢.

D. ___ **On Conscientious Objection & Guidance Responsibilities/Student Questionnaire.*** Sheet explaining conscientious objection and reasons why school guidance offices should provide students with C.O. information; questionnaire to help students explore whether their beliefs might conflict with enlisting or being drafted. (8/04) 50¢.

E. ___ **Adventures Working for Peace & Social Justice.*** List of sample projects offering youths opportunities to travel, do challenging work, help people in need and work for change; national and international. Living allowances and benefits vary. (7/97) 50¢.

F. ___ **Examples of Careers in Peacemaking and Community Activism.*** Sample list of careers for

young people to consider; suggests how the jobs can be used to work for peace and social justice and notes some skills and training needed for each career. Spanish/English. (8/06) 50¢.

G. ___ **So You Want to Be a Man.*** Speaks to those who think the military is the best way to prove one's manhood. Spanish/English, half-page flyer. (7/04) 40¢.

H. ___ **Aviso a Los Padres de Familia.*** Brochure addressing topics that may concern Spanish-speaking parents whose son or daughter is considering military enlistment. Provides information on the money for education myth, health issues, the treatment of women, citizenship, and the Delayed Entry Program. (10/05) 70¢.

I. ___ **COMO SALIR DEL DELAYED ENTRY PROGRAM (DEP) [PROGRAMA DE ENTRADA POSTERGADA] Te enrolaste en las fuerzas armadas. Ahora has cambiado de opinión.*** Instructions in Spanish on how to get out of the Delayed Entry Program; includes sample letter to recruiting commander. Based on English version from CCCO (see www.objector.org). (8/04) 50¢.

J. ___ **Act to Protect Your Privacy From Military Recruiters.*** Half-page flyer explaining how to opt out when high schools release student names, addresses and phone numbers to recruiters. Includes form letter that can be used to withhold information from recruiters. Spanish/English. (3/4/03). 50¢.

K. ___ Poster: **You Don't Have to Join the Military in Order to . . .** Sample of poster designed for San Diego area high school career centers, counseling offices, etc., with tear-off coupons. ('95) \$1.00.

M. Actions Students Can Take to Counter Military Recruiting in Schools and the Community.* Activity suggestions for high school students, plus contacts for resources. (7/06) 50¢.

School Access

N. San Diego CARD v. Governing Board of the Grossmont Union High School District.* 1986 decision by the Federal Court of Appeals for the 9th Circuit (Western U.S.), holding that the subject of military service is not an economic issue, but is "primarily political." Schools cannot exclude opposing viewpoints if a forum on military service has been created for proponents of the military (i.e., military recruiters or the Selective Service System). Useful for convincing schools to grant equal access to groups presenting alternative views. 16 pages. \$3.50.

O. Using Equal Access to Counter Militarism in High Schools.* Report on Project YANO's efforts to gain access to schools in San Diego County from 1984 to 1995. Discusses outreach strategies, legal basis for equal access, lessons learned by activists. Key correspondence with school districts is included in appendix. Very useful for getting a school outreach program started. (Significantly revised 7/06) 48 pages. \$6.50.

P. Options for Controlling Military Recruiter Access to Secondary Schools and Students.* Memo on the recruiter access law passed with the No Child Left Behind Act. Discusses school policies that can help limit recruiter access to student lists, etc. (1/03) 50¢.

Q. Some Objections to JROTC. Summary of some arguments against JROTC. Includes sample excerpts from Navy, Army & Air Force JROTC textbooks. 50¢.

R. JROTC and the San Diego Unified School District. Fact sheet with general background and anti-JROTC arguments prepared for local San Diego use. (2/95) 50¢.

S. San Diego Unified School District Review of Air Force JROTC Curriculum Materials. Report from official review committee which found textbooks to be inaccurate, distorted, insensitive to women, etc. (1994) 70¢.

T. Is JROTC More Expensive for Local Schools?* Uses personnel budget from one school to illustrate how JROTC can cost more than other educational programs. (1/96) 50¢.

U. You Expected Union Solidarity?—Not from JROTC Teachers! During a successful 1996 teachers

strike in San Diego, every JROTC instructor crossed teacher picket lines, despite the fact that they belonged to and enjoyed benefits from the teacher union. Flier is directed to other teachers and includes sample textbook quotes and arguments about why teachers should be concerned about the JROTC program. (1996) 50¢.

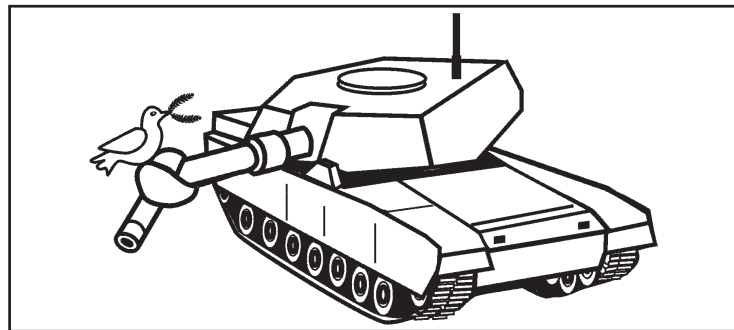
